DUET ACTING INFORMATION SHEET

Description of Event: Duet Acting is an event in which 2 students perform a scene from a published play.

Rules:

- 1. The performance will be no less than five minutes and no more than ten minutes in length.
- 2. The only props allowed are a table and two chairs. No other items in the room may be used and no make-up or costuming is allowed. Any special sound effects or other audible sounds may only be produced by the actors.
- 3. The scene presented should be from a published play of recognized literary merit and contain only two characters. The actors may speak to other imagined characters.
- 4. The performance should be memorized; cueing from any source is not allowed.
- 5. Each actor should identify their character before the scene begins. The introduction must be shared by both actors and must be given straight.
- *Violations of time or rules of the event should result in a flat 2-point deduction, regardless of the number of violations. It is up to the judge's discretion as to how this will affect the final ranking.

Criteria for Judging:

- 1. <u>Introduction:</u> Does the introduction adequately prepare the audience for the story?
- 2. <u>Delivery:</u> Did the speaker use appropriate techniques to enhance the effectiveness of their speech?
- 3. Characterization: Are the characters clear? Do they support the meaning of the story?
- 4. <u>Interpretation and Projection of the scene</u>: Is the material performed in a way that brings it to life for the audience?
